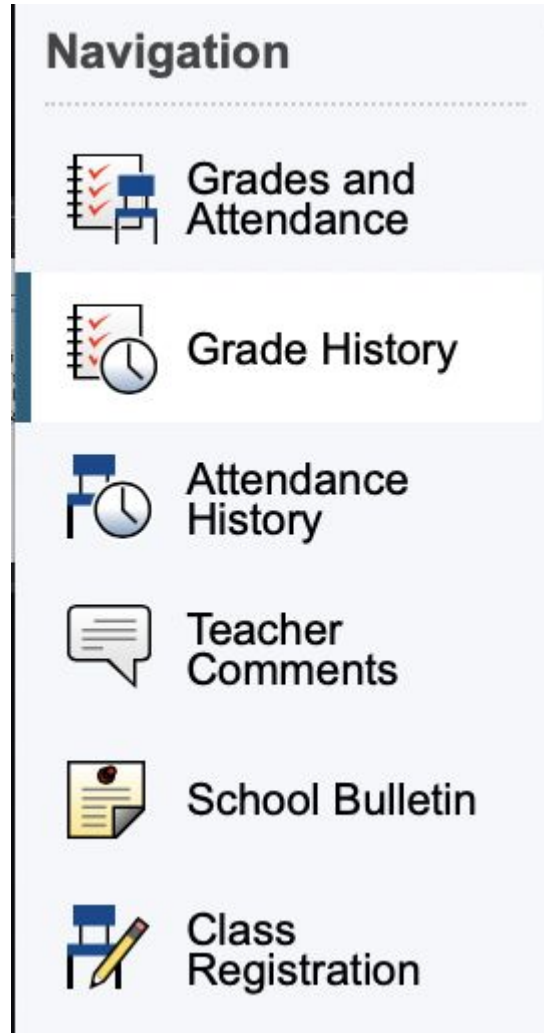

Admission Requirements and Application Information for STEM Magnet


- Application submitted during sophomore year from student at participating school partner.
