

 - Health
- Must complete the graduation project



College Courses

Bucknell* and Susquehanna Universities

- Must not be offered at our high school (unless already taken)
- Must fit into the student's schedule
- Tuition free
- Elective courses
- *Must be is the top 20% of the class (Bucknell)

SUN and Penn College Now

Commonwealth Early College (previously ACE)

- Full-time, dual enrolled student
- Tuition reduction plus scholarship opportunity
- Course can meet HS graduation requirements
- Must take 8 course and must complete graduation requirements

Senior Service

- Optional in place of an elective course
- Can be .25 (30 hours), .5 (60 hours), or 1 (120 hours) credit
- Must be completed during the school year either during or after school
- Must log hours and have a supervisor sign off on hours completed
- Three meetings with school counselor to monitor progress
- Schedules are not adjusted for senior service
- Students must apply and have a parent signature





5 PATHWAYS TO GRADUATION (2023)

- Keystone Proficiency
- Keystone Composite Score
- CTE Pathway
- Evidence-Based Pathway
- Alternate Assessment Pathway



Must take tests one time

Pathway 1- Keystone Prof.

Student takes and earns at least a 1500 on each of the following exams:

Algebra

Literature

Biology

Pathway 2- Keystone Comp.

Student takes and earns a combined score of 4452 or better on the three exams. In addition, students must be proficient on at least one test and at least basic on the other two.

*If students took a Keystone in 2019-2020 they were given a proficient/exempt but then it can't be used towards the combined proficiency

Pathway 3- CTE

Attainment of an Industry-Based Competency Certification related area of study (SUN)

Pathway 4-Alternate Assessment

Must pass course associated with Keystone AND

The student must meet or exceed any one of the established scores for the following approved alternative assessments to meet state high school graduation requirements regardless of the number of Keystone Exams for which the student did not achieve proficiency.

- -ACT composite score of 21
- -ACT WorkKeys NCRC (National Career Readiness Certificate) Gold Level*
- -ASVAB [Armed Forces Qualifying Test (AFQT)**] composite score of 31
- -PSAT/NMSQT total score of 970
- -SAT total score of 1010

Pathway 5-Evidence Based

Must pass course associated with Keystone AND

Evidence Based

 3 Pieces of Evidence consistent w/student goals

ONE or more from the first seven No more than TWO from the last five

- Attainment of 630 or better on any SAT Subject Test
- Attainment of Silver Level or better on ACT WorkKeys
- Attainment of 3 or better on any AP Exam
- Attainment of 3 or better on any IB Fxam
- Successful completion of any concurrent or postsecondary course
- Industry-recognized credentialization
- Acceptance into an other-than-4yr Institution of Higher Education (IHE) for college-level coursework

- Attainment of Proficient or Advanced on any Keystone Exam
- Successful completion of a servicelearning project
- Letter guaranteeing full-time employment or military enlistment
- Completion of an internship, externship, or cooperative education program
- Compliance with NCAA Division II academic requirements

Keystone (Starts May 13)

Who must take this year?

Anyone who didn't sit for the three exams already

Anyone, after discussion with administration, who may benefit from retaking one of the tests

Don't Worry!

There IS a pathway for everyone.
