College Courses

Bucknell* and Susquehanna Universities

- Must not be offered at our high school (unless already taken)
- Must fit into the student's schedule
- Tuition free
- Elective courses
- *Must be is the top 20% of the class (Bucknell)
- Course are weighted on HS transcript.

Commonwealth Early College (previously ACE)

- Full-time, dual enrolled student
- Tuition reduction (75% off)
- Course can meet HS graduation requirements
- Must take 8 course and must complete graduation requirements
- Course are weighted on HS transcript.

SUN and Penn College Now

Senior Service

- Optional in place of an elective course
- Can be .25 (30 hours), .5 (60 hours), or 1 (120 hours) credit, should schedule at least 6.5 credits in addition to SS.
- Must be completed during the school year either during or after school
- Must log hours and have a supervisor sign off on hours completed
- Three meetings with school counselor to monitor progress
- Schedules are not adjusted for senior service
- 1st semester, application with parent signature due 1st week, 2nd semester, prior to start of semester

Student Athletes - NCAA Eligibility Center

- Student athletes must register with the NCAA Eligibility Center to be eligible to play NCAA Division I or II sports in college. Athletes playing in Division III do not have to register.
- The NCAA Eligibility Center reviews the student athlete's academic record (Core course credits and GPA) to ensure conformity with NCAA rules.

Need-based money without repayment

Merit or performancebased money without repayment

SCHOLARSHIPS

WORK STUDY

Need-based campus jobs; earnings go toward tuition, fees, etc.

Fixed low-interest rate money that must be repaid

FEDERAL LOANS

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) - Student Aid.gov - usually opens Oct 1st.

<u>PHEAA</u> - Pa Higher Education Assistance Agency - <u>pheaa.org</u> Information on Grants, Loans, other funding programs, and college planning.

<u>CSS Profile</u> - Application used to award non-federal institutional aid.

<u>MySmartBorrowing.org</u> Salary rule of thumb - Do not borrow more for your education than you will make in your first year out of college.

<u>FinAid.org</u> - Financial aid information and tips to ease the financial burden of college expenses.

Junior opportunities

<u>Horatio Alger Association Scholarship Programs</u> - Targeted to students who have faced significant adversity in their lives and demonstrate critical financial need (\$55,000 or lower adjusted gross family income). The State and National Scholarships are now available to high school juniors!

<u>Cameron Impact Scholarship</u> - Applications are open for the Class of 2025. Four-year, full-tuition, impact-driven undergraduate scholarship awarded to 10-15 exceptional students who have demonstrated excellence in leadership, community service, extracurricular activities, and academics. QuestBridge - Rising seniors who have excelled academically despite financial hardship. Students apply to the National College Match. Recipients are granted early admission to one of QuestBridge's college partners with a full four-year scholarship.
